

Statement on Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)

Pukehina School aims to provide a safe and challenging learning environment for all akonga to strive and achieve their best through the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) initiative.

Te Poari Matua will guarantee to provide a physical and emotional safe place for all akonga and kaimahi. PB4L in our kura will improve the behaviour and wellbeing of akonga. Kaimahi will help akonga feel like they belong in our kura and be upskilled through professional learning development to support positive behaviours for learning in all environments.

PB4L will link to the kura PROUD values and outline what positive behaviours look like and are expected in different learning environments. These will include the voices of kaimahi, akonga and whanau.

A range of positive incentives will be used daily to acknowledge akonga behaviours.

Akonga will complete a 'Think Sheet' if and when behaviour is repetitive and unacceptable. This will be commented and signed by a kaimahi and sent home for whanau to comment. A record of this will be entered onto SMS (ETAP).

- We will not tolerate swearing, crying, answering back, getting stropy, leaving the classroom or physical activity games or refusing to complete learning activities.
- Whanau, we ask that you support us by speaking to your tamaiti/tamariki about appropriate behaviour at kura.
